WISCONSIN COUNTY, DISTRICT,& STATE FAIRS 2024 ANIMAL HEALTH RULES & REQUIREMENTS

SUMMARY

If a fair or livestock exhibition lasts more than 24 hours the sponsors must appoint a licensed Veterinarian to conduct a daily inspection of all livestock at the fair or exhibition. The Veterinarian shall review all records and test results required under ATCP 10.87. If a fair or exhibition lasts less than 24 hours, all records or test results required by ATCP 10.87 shall be reviewed by a licensed Veterinarian or by the show chairperson. Records shall include exhibitors name and address, identification of animals exhibited including number, type and description, documentation to show compliance with disease testing and other health requirements, and the livestock premise code, if any, of the premises from which the animals originate. If requested by the fair or show organizer, the documentation showing legal importation (if applicable) and movement to the event. Fair management must maintain these records for 5 years.

Please note: Except in specific circumstance, if an animal already bears an official 840 eartag, that eartag must not be removed and additional official eartags must not be applied. Instead the existing eartag must beand recorded when a record of that animal is required.

This is a summary of DATCP animal health requirements for exhibition only. These requirements may change due to animal disease emergencies in Wisconsin or other states. It is always advisable to check with the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health website or call (608-224-4872) for the most recent health requirements when planning to exhibit animals. Animals meeting exhibition requirements may not meet all import or movement requirements for other purposes. The fair and WDATCP have the right to make such tests and examinations as may be necessary to determine the disease status of any animal exhibited.

Animals that show evidence of having contagious or infectious diseases may not be commingled (housed/kept) with other animals at a fair, show or other exposition in such a way as to allow disease to spread. Such animals should not attend the fair, show or exhibition. Animals may be denied entry if they arrive at these events with contagious or infectious diseases, isolated and/or removed if they develop disease after arriving, or be subject to other action as would be necessary to control disease such as removed immediately, quarantined or slaughtered.

Bovine animals with ringworm, mange, warts or scab will be removed from the fair or exhibition premises, unless the veterinarian in charge finds the warts or ringworm lesions are incapable of transmitting disease.

CATTLE AND BISON

Cattle originating from within Wisconsin

There are no test or health document requirements for However, fair management is Wisconsin cattle. responsible for maintaining records of persons who have exhibited at the fair, the livestock premises code, if any, and the identification of animals shown for 5 years. Acceptable forms of animal identification for breeding animals are (1) an official USDA metal ear tag (the brite tag), (2) 15 digit "840" tags, (3) a breed registration number, (4) a breed registration tattoo, (5) other identification approved by the department, or farm ear tag. For steers, either an official USDA metal ear tag or the identification applied at weigh-in may be used. Entry blanks submitted and signed by exhibitors, including one of the forms of identification listed above will fulfill the exhibitor requirements. The fair's records of animals shown and exhibited are to be retained in case these are needed for disease tracing purposes.

Cattle originating from outside Wisconsin

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall accompany all cattle documenting official animal identification and all tests or certifications required. Animals must have at least one form of official individual ID (including steers). Animals must meet normal Wisconsin requirements for interstate movement. The Wisconsin Division of Animal Health website has current import requirements. Acceptable animal IDs for all cattle from outside Wisconsin are official USDA metal ear tags (NUES) (starts with state 2-digit code, also known as "brite" tag); this includes the orange brucellosis vaccination tag, and AIN 15-digit "840" tags (Visual or RFID). Manufacturercoded RFID tag-15-digit number with first three digits in 900s or American ID tag-8 to 12-digit number prefaced with "USA" are valid only if applied before March 11, 2015.

No cattle from outside Wisconsin are currently required to be brucellosis-tested or vaccinate to come to fairs ans shows in Wisconsin.

Tuberculosis requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin

Cattle originating from Michigan's TB Free

As of 1/1/2023, all cattle from Texas and Michigan's TB Free Zone, regardless of sex or age, are required to have a negative TB test within 60 days prior to import. Cattle originating from **Michigan's Modified Accredited zone**also need 1) Import permit, 2) To originate from a herd that has a negative whole-herd TB test within 12

months before arrival in Wisconsin that includes all animals 1 year and older, 3) Negative individual TB test within 60 days before entering Wisconsin and 4) To return directly to the state of origin after the show, and there must be a statement on the CVI that they will be doing so.

Cattle from Canada may be exhibited in Wisconsin if they meet current federal requirements to cross the international border.

SWINE

Swine originating from within Wisconsin

All swine shall be accompanied by a Wisconsin Intrastate Movement Certificate stating that the herd of origin has been inspected on the farm within 30 days prior to the exhibition and showed no signs of disease.

NOTE: Herd of origin means the herd in which the pigs currently reside, likely the exhibitor's herd. When pigs are purchased from a herd, the herd from which they originate is the herd of origin for the seller. Once the purchased pigs are added into the buyer's herd (even if the buyer's herd only consists of one or just a few animals), the buyer's herd becomes the new herd of origin and that herd must meet the testing requirements to move pigs again.

Non-terminal Exhibitions: All swine must have a PRRS (Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome) and PEDv (Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea virus) test of the herd of origin within 90 days of the exhibition. On the CVI, the test date, type of test and results of the test are to be included on the form. For swine originating from herds with positive tests, the herd plan number is to be included on the CVI.

Terminal Exhibitions: No testing requirements.

Terminal exhibitions are those at which the swine go directly from the fair/show to the slaughtering establishment OR to a slaughter only market sale. If going to a slaugher only market sale, contact the Division of Animal Health fair inspector for required information to collect.

The certificate must also include all required test documentation.

Swine originating from outside Wisconsin

Need a CVI that includes the following:

1) The negative results of the PRRS test from the swine's herd of origin conducted within 90 days prior to movement into Wisconsin including test date, type of test and results.

2) The negative results of the PEDv test from the swine's herd of origin conducted within 90 days prior to movement into Wisconsin including test date, type of test and results.

3) A statement that the veterinarian has inspected the entire herd of origin within the past 30 days and that no

clinical signs of PRRS and PEDv or any other apparent disease was present at the time of inspection

4) If the herd of origin tests positive for PRRS and/or

PEDv, contact the DATCP at 608-224-4872 for options.

5)Official identification number

Acceptable IDs for swine include: USDA silver ear tag, USDA 840 button ear tag, either visual or RFID; breed association tattoo if the pig is a purebred and the tattoo is registered, ear tag with premise ID number and unique identifier and ear notch (if the pig is a purebred and the notch is registered)..

Microchips are not accepted as official ID for any swine including pet pigs

SHEEP

Note: All sheep that go through a market or to slaugher and require Official ID must be eartagged with an Official ID (Tattoo and electronic microchip no longer sufficient) Sheep that go to a market or slaughter establishment after the fair should have an owner hauler statement to move from the fair to the market or slaughter establishment.

Sheep originating from within Wisconsin

Sexually-intact sheep of any age and all other sheep 12 months of age and older need an official individual ID. Official ID include scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tag, approved microchips if a reader is available and if accompanied by registration papers or breed association tattoo (as long as it is unique to that animal) accompanied by registration papers in the owner's name. Sheep cannot be under restriction for movement to fairs and shows. Sheep cannot have been exposed to scrapie if they are sexually intact.

Sheep originating from outside Wisconsin

All sheep need a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with an official individual ID. Per federal rule, the CVI should include a statement that the animals were not exhibiting clinical signs of scrapies and an owner statement pertaining to the status of the animals indicating whether the animal is or is not scrapies-positive, suspect, highrisk or exposed animal and whether it originated in an infected, source, exposed or noncompliant flock Official individual IDs include scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tags, approved microchips if a reader is available or breed association tattoo if accompanied by registration papers in the owner's name. Sheep cannot have been exposed to scrapie.

GOATS

Note: All goats that go through a market or to slaugher and require Official ID must be eartagged with an Official ID (Tattoo and electronic microchip no longer sufficient) Goats that go to a market or slaughter establishment after the fair should have an owner hauler statement to move from the fair to the market or slaughter establishment.

Goats originating from within Wisconsin

. Sexually-intact goats of any age and all other goats 12 months of age and older need an official individual ID. Official ID may be scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tag, approved microchips if a reader is available and accompanied by registration papers or breed association tattoo if accompanied with registration papers in the owner's name. Goats cannot have been exposed to scrapie if they are sexually intact.

Goats originating from outside Wisconsin

All goats need a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with an official individual ID. . Per federal rule, the CVI must include a statement that the animals were not exhibiting clinical signs of scrapies and an owner statement pertaining to the status of the animals or herd in regards to scrapies. Official individual IDs include scrapie ear tags or tattoos, USDA 840 button ear tags, approved microchips is a reader is available and accompanied with registration papers or breed association tattoo if accompanied by registration papers in the owner's name. Goats cannot have been exposed to scrapie.

Goats from Michigan's TB Modified Accredited Zone need import permits, negative whole-herd TB tests within 12 months before entering Wisconsin that include all animals 1 year or older and negative individual TB tests within 60 days before entering. Goats must return directly to the state of origin after the show with that statement on the CVI.

EQUINE

Equine animals originating from within Wisconsin

All equine animals shall be accompanied by documentation of a negative Equine infectious Anemia (EIA) test conducted within the previous 12 months which clearly identifies the equine by digital photographs, an approved microchip (if reader is available) or a complete description of the equine. Documentation forms include official test report VS 10-11, USDA-approved electronic test form, Global Vet Link EIA electronic form or CVI with test results listed.

Equine animals originating from outside Wisconsin

All equine animals shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and have been tested negative for equine infectious anemia (EIA) test conducted within the previous 12 months. The Certificate must clearly identify the equine by digital photographs, an approved microchip or a complete description of equine. No EIA test is needed for nursing foals accompanying negative dams.

Equines from Minnesota are exempt from the CVI requirement if ownership does not change while the animal is in Wisconsin, the animal remains in Wisconsin no longer than 7 days and proof of a current negative EIA test accompanies the animal.

SOUTH AMERICAN CAMELIDS: llamas, alpacas, guanacos, vicunas

South American camelids originating from within Wisconsin

There are no requirements.

South American camelids originating from outside Wisconsin

All South American camelids must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with official individual identification. Official IDs may be approved USDA ear tag number, microchip number, breed association registration number or breed association tattoo.

EXOTIC RUMINANTS (ruminants that are not native to Wisconsin and are not cervids)

Exotic ruminants from within Wisconsin

There are no requirements

Exotic ruminants from outside Wisconsin

They are required to have a written import permit and CVI with proof of negative Tuberculosis (within 60 days) and negative Brucellosis (within 30 days) tests. They need official animal ID as listed: Approved USDA ear tag number, Microchip number, Breed association registration number or Breed association tattoo.

Call in advance of the exhibition to the Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) for testing requirements.

POULTRY

(Pigeons are not considered poultry for fairs and shows)

Poultry and waterfowl from within Wisconsin

Need: A NPIP certificate stating that the birds originate from a US pullorum-typhoid clean or NPIP affiliate flock and (sexually mature) turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum or a DATCP-issued certificate stating they are from a Wisconsin Tested or Associate Flock and (sexually mature) turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum. Or individually test sexually mature birds within 90 days before arrival at the show. All birds must test negative for pullorum-typhoid and turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum.

These birds need wing or leg band IDs.

Poultry and waterfowl from outside Wisconsin

Need a certificate of veterinary inspection or equivalent (such as form VS 9-3) that states:

They originate from a flock classified pullorum-typhoid clean under NPIP or an equivalent state program and turkeys must test negative for Mycoplasma gallisepticum or If sexually mature, that they have tested negative for pullorum-typhoid (and Mycoplasma gallisepticum for turkeys) within 90 days before arrival at the show. These birds also need wing or leg band ID.

No import permit number needed.

CERVIDAE

For regulations for exhibition, contact DATCP-Animal Health at 608-224-4872.

DOGS, DOMESTIC CATS & other HOUSEHOLD PETS (ferrets, pet birds, rabbits, gerbils, guinea pigs, hamsters, domestic mice and rats)

Dogs and cats originating from within Wisconsin

Small animals from within Wisconsin

Dogs over 5 months of age must have proof of current rabies vaccination.

Cats and other household pets have no requirements.

Dogs and cats originating from outside Wisconsin

All dogs and domestic cats shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection stating the age of the animal and for animals 5 months or older the date of last rabies vaccination and revaccination due date. See ATCP 10.80 for specific vaccination information.

Other household pets from outside Wisconsin

Need certificates of veterinary inspection, but do not have testing or vaccination requirements.

EXOTIC SMALL ANIMALS (NOT INCLUDED ABOVE, EXOTIC LARGE ANIMALS AND OTHER WILD ANIMALS

Animals from within Wisconsin do not have any requirements as long as they are legally possessed in Wisconsin

Animals from outside Wisconsin generally have no testing or vaccination requirements, but do need a certificate of veterinary inspection and import permit number.

Note: Some animals may not be brought to Wisconsin. These are North American prairie dogs and the following African species: tree squirrels, rope squirrels, dormice, Gambian giant pouched rats, brush-tailed porcupines and striped mice.

Others may require permits from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

CIRCUS, RODEO, RACING AND MENAGERIE ANIMALS

Animals from within Wisconsin must meet vaccination and testing requirements for their species.

Animals from outside Wisconsin need certificates of veterinary inspection and vaccinations and tests required for their species. They also need import permit numbers if they are:1) Circus and individual circus acts or

2) rodeo stock other than individual participants' horses,3) multi-species menageries, or 4) petting zoos.

Fair managers: Please note that this requirement applies to all animals belonging to midway attractions and rodeos.

ADVISORY FOR HOUSING NON-TRADITIONAL LIVESTOCK AND FOR MANAGEMENT OF OTHER ANIMALS WHILE THE FAIR IS UNDERWAY:

The Department makes the following recommendations, but these are not required by statute or administrative rule:

1. South American camelids (llamas, vicunas, alpacas, and guanacos) and other exotic ruminants not be housed with domestic cattle.

2. Ratites (ostriches, emus, rheas, and cassowaries) should not be housed with domestic poultry.

3. Swine should not be housed with other mammalian species.

4. Bovine viral diarrhea (BVD) is an infectious disease of cattle that can spread rapidly under the conditions of a livestock show. The Department strongly recommends that all breeding cattle exhibited at Wisconsin fairs be properly vaccinated against BVD at least 30 days prior to the show. Exhibitors should consult with their veterinarians regarding the proper choice of vaccine and the correct schedule for its administration.

5. Recommend that cattle be test negative for BVD-PI byimmunoperoxidase test and negative for Johnes disease by the ELISA test.

6. Prohibit the use of common watering and feeding troughs.

7. Recommend all vehicles and equipment used to transport animals to and from the exhibition or used at the exhibition be cleaned and disinfected prior to and after use for this purpose.

8. Require all animals found to be afflicted with a contagious or infectious disease to be promptly removed from the premises.

9. Provide hand wash stations near all livestock facilities.

10. Recommend that all fairs add a space on livestock entry forms for the premises registration code.

11. Isolate exhibited animals returning to their farms or animals purchased at the show for 21 days before mingling them with other stock.

12. House cattle separately from small ruminants, especially sheep.

OPEN EXHIBITOR MUST BE 5 YEARS OLD BY JUNE 1ST OF SHOW YEAR

OPEN EXHIBITORS 62 YEARS & OLDER DO NOT HAVE TO ENTER THEIR PROJECTS IN THE SENIOR CITIZEN DEPARTMENT

Need not to be a resident of Columbia County to enter in any Department.

ENTRIES ACCEPTED MAY 1 THROUGH JUNE 20.

ENTRY DEADLINE: ALL entries must be delivered or postmarked on or before June 20th of the current fair year NO EXCEPTIONS. Entry forms can be turned in any time after May 1st. You don't have to wait until June 20th

- THERE IS A \$5 ENTRY FEE PER OPEN CLASS EXHIBITORS PAYABLE BY EXHIBITOR ON ENTRY DAY OR WHEN ENTRY TAGS ARE PICKED UP OR FEES COULD BE SENT TO COLUMBIA COUNTY FAIR, PO BOX 57, PORTAGE.

- IN ORDER TO BE A VALID ENTRY, FEES NEED TO BE PAID PRIOR TO ENTRY AND JUDGING AT THE FAIR. INVALID ENTRIES DO NOT RECEIVE PREMIUMS.

- ONLY ONE ENTRY PER LOT NUMBER IS ALLOWED BY AN EXHIBITOR WITH THE EXCEPTION THAT AN EXHIBITOR CAN ENTER TWO (2) ENTRIES PER INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL LOTS AND ONE (1) ENTRY PER GROUP ANIMAL LOT IN OPEN GOAT AND THREE (3) ENTRIES PER LOT IN OPEN POULTRY.

- All cattle entered for premiums shall be recorded in the proper or respective herd books of America and Certificate of registry must be displayed to Superintendent or Judge.

- No animal exhibited in the Junior Fair class will be eligible for competition in the Open Class. Except in group classes when they are NOT offered in the Junior Classes. Junior dairy entries can alsobe for Open Class.

- Little Britches showmanship will be held during the livestock shows. Children under 9 years old may sign-up prior to or during the show. Sign-up sheets will be available. Prizes will be awarded.

- Exhibits must be in place by 7:00 p.m. on entryday (Tuesday) and cannot be removed before 4:00 p.m. of

A SPRING CALF is one born on or after March 1, 2024. A WINTER CALF is one whose date of birth is between December1, 2023 and February 29, 2024. A FALL CALF is one whose date of birth is between September 1, 2023 and November 30, 2023. A SUMMER YEARLING is one whose date of birth is between June 1, 2023 and August 31, 2023. A SPRING YEARLING is one whose date of birth is between March 1, 2023 and May 31, 2023. A WINTER YEARLING is one whose date of birth is between December 1, 2022 and February 28, 2023. 

COUNTY AND DISTRICT FAIR REGULATIONS

2022 CHAPTER ATCP 160

ATCP 160.01 DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

(1) "Breed class" and "breeding class" mean a specific breed within a class such as Holstein in the dairy class.

(2) "Class" means a grouping in which exhibits may be entered, including an animal breed or age group for animal exhibits; a type of produce, crop or food; or a specific age, age group or educational grade level of exhibitor.

(2m) "Conference judging" means a judging system using a discussion about each exhibit with the entire group.

(3) "Danish judging system" means a judging system that allows for multiple first, second, third and fourth class selections as provided in s. ATCP 160.91 (4) (b)

(4) "Department" as it relates to the organizational structure of a fair, means as animal species, production

group, or other principal classification of exhibits. As used in any other context, "department" means the state of Wisconsin department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection.

(5) "Division means one of 3 exhibitor group classifications for a fair and is limited to junior division, open division and senior citizens division.

(6) "Entry class" means a class in which the fair allows exhibitors to submit entries.

(7) "Exotic domestic animal" means an animal that is not a common farm animal.

(7e) "Face-to-face judging" means a judging system using a semiprivate discussion between the judge and the exhibitor with the following phases:

(a) Get acquainted. (b) Learn the background of the exhibit. (c) Self-evaluation. (d) Evaluator comment (e) Parting

(7m) "Fair" means a county or district fair eligible to receive state aid under s. 93.23 (1) (b) or (c), Stats.

(7s) "Fair board" means the governing entity of a fair.

(8) "Lot" or "lot number" means the numerical designation assigned by a fair for a specific category of exhibits within a class.

(9) "Market class" means a class that includes animals of a certain weight for the species that can be sold for slaughter

(10) "Premium" means a monetary prize that a fair awards to an exhibitor after judging all competing exhibits in the class to which the premium pertains.

(11) "Regular judging system" means a judging system that allows for one first, second, third and fourth class selection as provided in s. ATCP 160.91 (4) (c)

(12) "Self determined project" means a project that meets criteria (a) through (d)

(13) "Youth organization" means an organization under adult leadership that has educational programming

ATCP 160.02 PREMIUM REQUIREMENTS(1) General. (a)The state aid authorized by s. 93.23 (1),

Stats.may be paid on net premiums paid by a fair. The department may withhold state premium aid from any fair which does not enforce the animal health provisions under ch. ATCP 10 that are applicable to animals exhibited at the fair. State aid will be paid only on premiums actually paid by bank check or draft.

(b) No deductions may be made from premium money won by an exhibitor. Premiums may, however,may be withheldwhere exhibition rules established by the fair association are violated. A written statement of violation shall be submitted to the department to justify action taken by local fair.

(c) Premiums offered shall be definite in amount. No decrease or increase in published premiums may be made because of the financial condition of the organization, or for any other reason.

(e) No fair may receive state aid for a premium awarded to any exhibitor in the open division if that exhibitor entered the same exhibit in the in the junior division at the same fair. This paragraph does not apply if the exhibit was entered in the junior division only as part of a herd group, carcass class or performance class.

(f) No state aid will be paid on the cost of ribbons, cups, trophy prizes or entertainment contests.
(2) PREMIUM LISTS. (a) Premiums for which state aid is requested by county and district fairs shall conform with the uniform premium list and other requirements set forth in these rules. Fairs requesting state aid for net premiums shall submit to the department a printed copy of the premium list used at the fair, as required under ATCP 160.92 (3) (c).

(b) The officers of each fair shall mail a copy of the premium list to other associations, societies, or boards conducting a fair in Wisconsin upon request.

(c) Sections ATCP 160.01 through 160.07 and 160.91 shall be published in premium books used by a fair for which state aid is requested.

(3) ENTRY FEES. (a) A fair may charge an exhibitor an entry fee or charge stall rents for animals or both.

(b) Exhibitors in educational department 35 shall not be required to purchase an exhibitor's ticket. Any other exhibitor may be required, if no entry fee is charged, to purchase an exhibitor's season ticket at a price not to exceed that charged for a non-exhibitor's season ticket.

(4) SPLIT FAIR DATES

(a) For purposes of this subsection, "split fair dates" occur when a fair organization judges exhibits or contests and pays premiums at more than one time or at more than one location during the calendar year.

(b) Except as provided under par. (c), the department may not pay state aid for a fair having split dates, unless the department gives advanced written approval for a split fair. The department may approve split dates based on hardship.

(c) The department may pay state aid for the following exhibits or contests in a fair having split dates with advanced notification to the department:

1. Clothing revue, 2. Demonstrations, 3. Favorite foods revue, 4. Dogs, 4m. Cats, 5. Small animals, 6. Rocketry, 7. Shooting sports,

7m. Mechanical projects, 8. Other exhibits and contests that are similar to those identified in subds.1. to 7.

(d) If there are split dates under par. (b) or (c), all blue ribbon winners shall repeat their demonstrations or exhibits at the regular fair dates unless the department grants a hardship exemption. An exhibitor may use audio-visual media, still photography, or an educational display to repeat a demonstration or exhibit.

ATCP 160.03 EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS. A fair shall meet all the exhibition requirements of this section to be eligible for state premium aid.

(1) No fair society or other organization sponsoring a fair shall require an exhibitor to become a member of the organization in order to enter an exhibit at the fair, nor may the sponsoring organization make any deduction from an exhibitor's premium as a donation to the fair society, or require an exhibitor in any other way to make a donation to the society.

(2) State aid may not be approved for out-of-state exhibits or for separate classes of local and non-local exhibitors. Aid may not be approved for payment of premiums to an exhibitor having an out -of-state address but claiming Wisconsin residency unless the fair secretary provides the department with an affidavit that the exhibitor's residence is geographically located within the state.

(3) State aid may be paid only on articles or animals actually on display in an exhibit building or actually shown in the show ring on regular fair dates unless approval for split dates in obtained under s. ATCP 160.02 (4). State aid may not be paid on Dairy Herd Improvement Association records, transportation aid, production contests or other special exhibits unless prior approval is obtained under s. ATCP 160.49 (7).

(4) State aid may not be paid on exhibits removed from thefair grounds before 4 p.m. of the last day of the fair, or such other later time as may be specified by the fair, without prior approval of the department. Authority for earlier removal may be granted by the department in case of meat sales, or other special classes, if requested before the beginning of the fair. In other hardship cases, approval may be granted by the fair. Exhibits in dog obedience and small animal pet classes may be judged during the regular fair but are not required to remain present during the entire fair. The fair may prescribe the length of time junior fair exhibitors of horses shall keep their animals on the grounds.

ATCP 160.49-Junior Fair division; general requirements. (1) Eligibility. In the junior fair division, the department may pay state aid on prizes offered to exhibitors who are 8 to 20 years of age on January 1 of the current fair year and exhibitors who are 5-9 years of age on January 1 of the current fair year who are exhibiting under s. ATCP 160.65. A fair board may establish specific entry classes within each department. A county or district fair board may establish subgroups within a junior fair entry class based on the exhibitor's age or grade level in school. The department may not pay state aid on prizes for club parades, club floats, song contests, or a project which is not an exhibit or demonstration at the fair.

(2) All exhibitors in the junior fair division shall be members of a youth organization approved by the fair board.

(3) Exhibits in the junior fair shall be a product of the exhibitor's own labor. An exhibit may include a study project, merit project, or other special project, a skill area or a supervised occupational experience in which the exhibitor is regularly enrolled, provided that the fair board approves the project, skill area or supervised occupational experience as an exhibit.

(4) State aid may not be used to award more than one premium to an exhibitor in a premium or lot number in the junior fair division. (There are 3 exceptions).

(5) State aid may not be used to award a premium to an exhibitor who exhibits an item or animal that has been

exhibited in the junior division previously in a state aid funded fair in that calendar year and resulted in a premium being awarded for that item or animal.

(7) Within any junior fair department, a fair may establish special classes where none are specified under this subchapter. Special classes may include classes for grade and crossbred females in the beef, swine, sheep and horse departments. Premiums for special classes shall be equal to premiums for comparable classes established in the same department.

(8) The fair board may establish specific classes are age or grade level groupings within classes for each of the junior fair department 14 to 16, 18, 20 to 29, 31, 33 and 34.

(9) Judging in the junior fair division may be done using regular, face-to-face, conference or Danish judging system.

ATCP 160.05 OPEN DIVISION; General Requirements.

(1) The total maximum premiums set forth for all places in any open division livestock class, excluding poultry and rabbits, may be divided into premiums for a greater number of places, but the maximum premium offered for any additional place shall not be higher than the maximum for last place in the class.

(2) All animals in any open division class shall be owned by the exhibitor, except as provided in s. ATCP 160.09

(3) State aid may be paid on no more than 2 premiums awarded an exhibitor under one premium or lot number in open division individual livestock classes, except poultry and rabbits, and no more than one premium in all other classes, including poultry and rabbits.

(4) State aid may not be used to award a premium to an exhibitor who exhibits an item or animal that has been exhibited in open class separation previously in a state aid funded fair in that calendar year and resulted in a premium being awarded for that item or animal.

(5) The fair board may establish specific classes by professional and amateur level groupings within classes for open class departments 14 to 28.

ATCP 160.39 SENIOR CITIZENS DIVISION; General Requirements.

(1) The age of exhibitors in the senior citizens division is limited to persons 62 years of age or older.

(2) Exhibitors in the senior citizens division may not enter identical items or articles in both the senior citizens division and the corresponding classes of the regular open division.

(3) State aid may not be used to award more than one premium to an exhibitor in a premium or lot number in the senior citizen division.

(4) State aid may not be used to award a premium to an exhibitor who exhibits an item that has been exhibited in the senior citizen division previously in a state aid funded fair in that calendar year and resulted in a premium being awarded for that item. ATCP 160.07 CLASSES; General Requirements

(1) Classes may be combined if the number of entries in several single classes is insufficient. If any classes are combined, state aid shall be limited to the maximum total premiums listed for a single class of animals, items, or articles in that department.

(2) (a) Except as provided under par. (b), no fair may receive state aid for premiums awarded sexually intact male dairy cattle, beef cattle, sheep, goats, swine or horses unless those animals are registered. Registered status shall be documented by a certificate of registry from the appropriate breed association or society, or by a copy of the application for registration.

(b) Paragraph (a) does not apply to dairy cattle exhibited at a fair if a national breed association certifies that those dairy cattle are recorded in that breed association's qualified herd book which records the genealogy of that breed.

(3) Any animal entered as part of a group class may also be exhibited in a class for individual animals.

(4) Boars may not be entered as an exhibit in the swine department unless their tusks have been removed.

(5) The age of an animal, for the purposes of determining an entry class under this chapter, shall be determined as of the opening day of the fair.

ATCP 160.91 JUDGING REGULATIONS

(1) Judging shall be done at fairs by individuals who are registered with the department. In no case shall any person who is an officer or director of a fair be eligible to judge exhibits at such fair; nor shall any person interested directly or indirectly in exhibits shown in any department of a fair be eligible to judge articles or animals in that department.

(1m)

(a) An individual shall register by submitting to the department an application. The department shall register all individuals who qualify to be judges, including having the knowledge, training, or experience in the specific classes to be judged and adhering to ethical judging practices. The registration is valid for 5 years.

(b) An individual submitting an application after July 1 may not judge for the current fair year.

(c) A fair representative may request the department waive par. (b) in cases of unanticipated emergency situations.

(2) Each judge at a fair shall be provided with a copy of the fair's premium book or list of entry classes as least 7 days prior to the opening date of the fair.

(3) No animal or article, irrespective of the number of entries in the class in which it is entered, shall be awarded a higher rating than its merit would entitle it to in comparison to the standard of perfection in the class.

(4) (a) Danish system judging may be used in the junior division. State aid may not be paid on premiums awarded under the Danish system in any other division.

(b) When classes in the junior fair division are judged according to the Danish system, 4 group placings

shall be awarded in any class. When there are less than 8 exhibitors in the class, there shall not be more than 2 in the first group, not more than 4 in the first 2 groups and not more than 6 in the first 3 groups. If there are 8 or more entries in the class, there shall not be more than 25% in the first group, not more than 50% in the first 2 groups, and nod more than 75% in the first three groups.

(c) The number of awards in the last group placing may be increased to the extent necessary to give awards to all exhibitors.

(4g) When classes in the junior fair division are judged using the conference judging system, the judge shall use sub. (4) (b) and (c) to award placements in the class.

(5) If any class of exhibits at a fair is judged according to the regular system, the judges for that class may give only one first-place, one second-place, one third-place and one fourth-place in that class.
